

RIDER ADVANCEMENT

A rider can either be moved up or down a classification based on their level of experience and riding ability by the discretion of the CMMC Board of Directors at any time.

TRANSFER POINTS

Transfer points will be awarded to the riders finishing in the top 30% of his event, where there are five riders or more, according to the chart included in this rulebook.

1. Transfer points are awarded to experience based classes only.

Rider advancement, to a higher class, is based on the number of transfer points earned, according to the following:

1. 4 points for First Timer to 0-6 or 7-8 (Pee Wee class) and Intro to Motocross.
2. *4 points for Junior Cycle 0-8 Beginner Pee Wee Track to Junior Cycle 0-8 Main Track. Also Applies to 65 Beginner through 11 Main Track.
3. *6 points for Mini Cycle and Motorcycle Beginner to Novice.
4. 8 points for Mini Cycle and Motorcycle Novice to Intermediate.
5. 12 points for Mini Cycle and Motorcycle Intermediate to Expert.

A rider will be responsible to review postings of Advancements Points to date and advance accordingly when his/her required amount of transfer points are earned.

One half (1/2) of total transfer points earned during this racing season will be carried over into the next racing season. Except for the Beginner classes all points will be carrier over.

RIDER ADVANCEMENT WITH OTHER ORGANIZATIONS

If a rider is moved up in class by another racing organization before the CMMC transfer points are earned, the rider must also move up in the same experience based class with CMMC. The rider must race with CMMC at the highest level that he/she is classified with any other race organization.

BEGINNER RIDERS

*Riders moving from one bike classification to another will be allowed to drop down one rider classification. Riders moving back to a beginner class will be required to transfer out of the beginner class at ½ the required amount of advancement points.

Beginner riders may ride in either an age group class or open classes as a second class to give these riders the opportunity for additional track time and racing experience. Once the rider no longer rides the beginner class as the first class he/she can not go back to the beginner class for that bike size. This does not include the Pee Wee 1st timers Class.

OTHER

Vet riders may drop back one rider classification in the regular motorcycle classes.

Women riders may drop back one rider classification in the regular classes.
